

MOTORCYCLING QUEENSLAND PERMIT FEE STRUCTURE FOR COACHING

1. \$1.50 per rider (up to a maximum of \$250) – Club based Coaching

This fee structure offers licenced coaches the opportunity to provide coaching to MQ licence holders as a group or on a one on one basis., at an affordable rate where an individual coach is facilitating the coaching ie -not an organisation or company.

The Coach will need to complete the “Coaching Report” form and return it to MQ along with the A3 indemnity forms, Day licences and Injury Reports within 14 days of completion of the coaching session.

MQ will invoice the coach and provide the invoice by email. In the instance where the fee exceeds the \$250 ‘Professional Coaching Fee’ (as explained below) the coach may choose to pay a ceiling fee of \$250.

2. Professional Coaching fee

The professional coaching fee (\$250 for a 1 or 2 day coaching clinic, or by negotiation for 3 or more days) is applicable to professional coaching organisations or companies, such as Academy of Off Road Riding, Team-Moto Coaching, Full-Throttle Sports conducting professional coaching schools at MQ Licenced tracks.

The payment of this fee is required in advance, and is submitted with the application for a Coaching permit.

The \$250 ‘Professional Coaching Fee’ also applies to coaches conducting Supercross, Stadium Motocross or Freestyle accreditation schools, where it is generally accepted that the Coach will charge a significant fee for attendees to attend, and therefore expect to make a substantial profit.

The Coach will need to complete the “Coaching Report” form and return it to MQ along with the A3 indemnity forms, Day licences and Injury Reports within 14 days of completion of the coaching session.

3. Commercial Coaching Fee

The Commercial Coaching Fee (\$300 for 1 or 2 day clinic, or via negotiation for 3 days or more) applies where the coaching/training being offered provides no obvious benefit to MQ licenced riders, and it is simply an opportunity for an organisation / company / individual to utilise MQ’s pre-existing insurance arrangements.

Currently, the only organisation that accessing this kind of coaching fee structure is The Academy of Off Road Riding for industry specific Quad ATV Training.

The payment of this fee is required in advance, and is submitted with the application for a Coaching permit.

The Coach will need to complete the “Coaching Report” form and return it to MQ along with the A3 indemnity forms, Day licences and Injury Reports within 14 days of completion of the coaching session.
