1. ANNOUNCEMENT:		
Charters Towers Motorcycle Club Inc., hereafter called the PROMOTER will conduct a Zone Short moto-x under lights for Juniors and Seniors at Gladstone Creek Raceway on Saturday March 8, 2008.		
2. JURISDICTION:		
2.1. The abovementioned meetings have been authorised by MQ who has issued the Motorcycling Australia Permit Number's (as above) and are open to holders of current Motorcycling Australia National, Club, Nipper and One Meeting Licences (OML licences to junior riders only if holding a current Log Book), who are full financial members of the A BONA FIDE NORTHERN REGIONAL CLUB (no discount or one day memberships are allowed).		
2.2. The meeting will be held in accordance with the current Manual of Motorcycle Sport (MOMS), these Supplementary Regulations, and any Further Instructions approved by MQ.		
BY ENTERING THIS MEETING ALL PARTIES AGREE TO COMPLY WITH THESE RULES, REGULATIONS, BY-LAWS AND INSTRUCTIONS.		
3. ENTRIES:		
3.1. Entries open forthwith and will be accepted on the day of the race meetings, before the close of Scrutineering.		
3.2. Only entries received on the official Entry Form that are accompanied by the correct fee will be accepted.		
4. INSURANCE:		
4.1. National Personal Accident Scheme provides basic cover for death and permanent disability.		
4.2. Ambulance Insurance is compulsory for licensees.		
4.3. IT IS STRONGLY RECOMMENDED THAT COMPETITORS GIVE CONSIDERATION TO TAKING OUT WEEKLY BENEFITS INSURANCE.		
5. MEDICAL SERVICES:		
Qualified First Aid personnel will be in attendance at each race meeting, from the start of practice until fifteen minutes after the last race/event.		
6. ENTRY FEE:		
6.1. Entry fees will be:- Senior:- \$30 (1 st class) extra \$10 / additional class Junior:- \$30 (1 st class) extra \$10 / additional class 50cc Division One :- \$15 / extra \$10 additional class 50cc Division Two:- \$15 / extra \$10 additional class Gate fees: \$5 per person or \$15 per car		
6.2. Payment is by cash or cheque only. ANY FEES FOR DISHONoured CHEQUES WILL BE THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE ENTRANT.		
6.3. Cheques are to be made payable to Charters Towers Motorcycle Club Inc.		

7. CLASSES OF COMPETITION & RACE FORMAT:

1. 50cc Auto Division 1- 4/8yrs inc(all homologated Div 1 plus other suitable machines) Demonstration class 3 x 7 minutes
2. 50cc Auto Division 2 - 7/8 yrs inc 3 x 7 minutes
3. 65cc 7/12 yrs inc 3 x 5 laps
4. Mini Lites 9/11 yrs inc (80/85cc 2/- & 150cc 4/- (competition model) Small Wheel only) 3 x 5 laps
5. Mini Lites 12/15 yrs inc (80/85cc 2/- & 150cc 4/- (competition model) Small Wheel or Big Wheel) 3 x 5 laps
6. Junior Lites 13/15 yrs inc (87cc to 125cc 2/- & 127cc to 250cc 4/-) 3 x 6 laps
7. Senior Lites (all grades) (up to 125cc 2/- & up to 250cc 4/-) 3 x 6 laps
8. Senior Open (all grades) (127cc to 510cc 2/- & 255cc to 663cc 4/-) 3 x 6 laps
9. Senior Unlimited (all grades) all capacity machines 3 x 6 laps
10. Unlimited Veterans (over 30 yrs) (all grades and all capacity machines) 3 x 4 laps
11. Unlimited Women's Class (all grades and all capacity machines) 3 x 5 laps
12. Quads Unlimited 3 x 4 laps

8. AWARDS AND PRIZEMONEY:

- 8.1 Awards and prizemoney for all classes will be determined on the day.
- 8.2 All 50cc Auto Div 1 participants shall receive an encouragement / participation award.
- 8.3 50cc Auto Div 2 will receive Trophies for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place in lieu of Prizemoney.
- 8.4 Prizemoney:- 1st \$50, 2nd \$30, 3rd \$20.
- 8.5 Prizemoney must be collected on the day. Any prizemoney not collected on the day will be forfeited to the club.

9. ENTRIES TO CONSTITUTE A CLASS:

- 9.1 To constitute a Class, the number of contestants entered and competing in each Class may be eight (8).
- 9.2 Should there be insufficient entries in any Class of Competition, the decision to run or cancel the Class, or to combine events and re-distribute any awards, or to alter prizemoney awarded, will be at the discretion of the club, subject to the MQ steward's approval.
- 9.3 If the nominated riders exceed the 14 start gates heats will be run and points will be accumulated for an overall total.

10. MACHINES AND RIDERS:

- 10.1 All machines entered must comply with the current MOMS for Motocross Competition.
- 10.2 Multiple entry of the one Machine in the same Class of Competition is not permitted.
- 10.3 Change of machine may be permitted if submitted in writing to the Clerk of Course and with the approval of the MQ Steward at least ten (10) minutes prior to the start of the event in which the substitution is requested. Substitute machine must have passed machine examination, be eligible for the class and replace a machine that cannot be reasonably repaired. Notification of change of bike and new number must be made to lap-scorers before the start of the event.

11. RIDING NUMBERS:

- 11.1 Wherever possible, competitors will be allocated their Registered Riding Number (the riding number on their licence). All others will be allocated numbers at the Club's discretion.
- 11.2 All Number Plates on all Machines MUST comply with the MOMS.

12. GRID POSITIONS:

Grid positions will be by allocated by peg draw. If more than 14 riders are nominated heats will be run with points accumulated towards a total score for overall prizemoney.

13. RIDERS BRIEFING:

A Riders Briefing will be held prior to the commencement of racing and ALL Competitors MUST attend the Riders Briefing.

14. DRUG AND OR ALCOHOL TESTING:

- 14.1 All competitors and officials are advised that as part of the MA drug education program, drug testing may take place at any competition in accordance with Australian Sports Commission policy as implemented by the Australian Sports Drug Agency.
- 14.2 If any doubts exist over banned substances it is recommended competitors telephone the Drugs in Sport Hotline 1800 020506. When drug testing takes place, the payment of prizemoney may be delayed at the Promoter's discretion until the results of the tests are known.

15. CODE OF CONDUCT:

All Competitors, Officials and Parents are reminded of the Motorcycling Australia By-Law - CODE OF CONDUCT (as stipulated in the MOMS) which is a guide to appropriate behaviour at all Motorcycle Race Meetings. This CODE OF CONDUCT applies to this Meeting and will be enforced.

16. TIMETABLE:

Machinery:	1.30am – 2.30pm (Includes time for riders to inspect the track by foot.)
Riders Briefing:	2.45pm
Practice:	3.00pm
Racing	Starts immediately after the conclusion of practice.

For the purposes of drug & alcohol testing, the commencement of the meeting will be deemed to be **1.30pm** with the completion of the meeting for the participant being when the participant has vacated the venue.

17. CIRCUIT DESCRIPTION:

Short Moto – X is made of man made obstacles approx. 800m in length, made of decomposed granite with 200 lux of lighting.

18. STARTS:

All starts will be by fourteen (14) self-penalizing gates. Quads will be started by flag start.

19. RACING:

There will be a minimum of five laps of practice offered per class. Race format will be as per paragraph seven (7). Race format may be adjusted on the day if time constraints require it, with the approval of the MQ steward.

20. NOISE:

Machine noise will be controlled as per the MOMS.

21. SPECIAL NOTES AND WARNINGS:

- 21.1 Junior Lite class is (87cc to 100cc BW, 125cc two stroke and 127cc to 250cc four stroke) machine. No 85cc two stroke BW or 150cc four stroke BW permitted in the Junior Lites class.
- 21.2 Senior Women and Veterans class may be combined if insufficient entries received.
- 21.2 Senior Lites class is (125cc two stroke and up to 250cc four stroke).
- 21.3 Senior Open class is (127cc two stroke up to 550cc and 255cc four stroke up to 663cc).
- 21.4 The Mini Lites 9/11 yrs & 12/15 yrs (unless numbers do not permit it) will be raced together but scored separately.
- 21.5 A junior rider's age on January 1 will determine his/her age for competition for the year. However, a rider may move to the next higher class when he/she becomes eligible to do so at any time during the year, but once a rider moves to the higher age class in any competition, he/she may not move back to the lower age class. Points earned in a lower age class will not transfer to the higher age class. This rule will apply to all riders up to and including 16 year olds.
- 21.6 Junior riders cannot compete in two different age groups with the same bike at the same meeting. If they choose to stay in a lower age group they are not considered to be eligible for a higher age group. EG (Mini Lites 9-11yrs & 12-15yrs)
- 21.7 Riders cannot compete in both Junior and Senior Classes at the same meeting.
- 21.8 Senior riders cannot compete in Lites and Open classes with the same machine, they can ride in the unlimited class on the same machine.
- 21.9 The Mini Lites 12-15 yrs is open to Standard Wheel or Big Wheel motorcycles, the Mini Lites 9-11 yrs is only open to Standard Wheel Motorcycles.
- 21.10 A Flag Marshal levy of \$5.00 (this amount may be reviewed) is included in the entry fee. This does not exempt the rider from supplying a Flag Marshal should circumstances require it. Failure to supply a Marshal / Official / Assistant / Worker, may result in exclusion from the meeting. Flag Marshals are paid \$25 per session. Morning session is, Practice/Race one of each class. Afternoon session is, Race Two/Race Three of each class.**
- 21.11 Presentations will be held as soon as possible after the conclusion of racing. Presentations will take place at the canteen area.
- 21.12 Camping is permitted – NO CAMP FIRES.
- 21.13 Canteen facilities will be available.

CONTRACT TO PARTICIPATE IN THE Charters Towers Motorcycle Club Short MX

WARNING! THIS IS AN IMPORTANT DOCUMENT WHICH AFFECTS YOUR LEGAL RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS, PLEASE READ IT CAREFULLY AND DO NOT SIGN IT UNLESS YOU ARE SATISFIED YOU UNDERSTAND IT.

1. I THE UNDERSIGNED (see below): Insert Name

HEREBY AGREE with Motorcycling Australia Limited ("MA") that I am by this agreement entitled to participate in the motorcycle activity/meeting listed in Schedule 2 (hereinafter called "the Meeting" or the "Event") at the venue listed at Schedule 3 (hereinafter called "the Venue") on the terms and conditions set out in this document.

2. DEFINITIONS In this declaration:

- a) "Claim" means and includes any action, suit, proceeding, claim, demand, damage, cost or expense however arising including but not limited to negligence but does not include a claim against a Motorcycling Organisation under any right expressly conferred by its constitution or regulation;
- b) "Indemnitees" means and includes the persons, organisations and bodies corporate whose names appear in Schedule 1.
- c) "MA" means Motorcycling Australia Limited;
- d) "State Controlling Body" (SCB) means a state or territory motorcycling association affiliated as a member of MA;
- e) "Motorcycling Activities" means performing or participating in any capacity in any authorised or recognised Motorcycling Organisation event, meeting or activity;
- f) "Motorcycling Organisation" means and includes MA, and the MA members (including the SCBs and affiliated clubs) and where the context so permits, their respective directors, officers, members, servants or agents.

3. ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF RISKS, DANGERS & OBLIGATIONS

I ACKNOWLEDGE that:

- a) motorcycle sport is dangerous and that by engaging in the sport (whether as a competitor, recreational rider, coach, official or media) at the Meeting I take and am exposed to certain risks and dangers and am under certain obligations as follows:
 - i) that I may be injured, physically or mentally, and may be killed;
 - ii) that my machinery or equipment may be damaged, lost or destroyed;
 - iii) that competitors may ride dangerously or with a lack of skill;
 - iv) that track or event conditions may be hazardous and may vary without warning or predictability;
 - v) that organisers, officials, landowners/track operators and any agents or representatives of those in charge of meetings are frequently obliged to make decisions under pressure of time/or events;
 - vi) that any policy of insurance of or in respect of my life or physical or mental health may be voided;
 - vii) that there may be no or inadequate facilities for treatment or transport of me if I am injured;
 - viii) that I have an obligation to myself and to others to act safely and within the rules and regulations of MA;
- b) the Indemnitees do not make any warranty that the services at the Meeting will be provided with due care and skill or that any materials provided in connection with the services will be fit for the purpose for which they are supplied;
- c) to the extent that any warranty is implied it is excluded to the full extent permitted by law;
- d) have voluntarily read and understood this warning and accept and assume the inherent risks in participating in the Event.

4. WARNING UNDER THE FAIR TRADING ACT 1999 (VIC)

Under the provisions of the Fair Trading Act 1999 (Vic) several conditions are implied into contracts for the supply of certain goods and services. These conditions mean that the supplier named on this form is required to ensure that the recreational services it supplies to you are: - rendered with due care and skill; - as fit for the purpose for which they are commonly bought as it is reasonable to expect in the circumstances; and - reasonably fit for any particular purpose or might reasonably be expected to achieve any result you have made known to the supplier.

Under section 32N of the Fair Trading Act 1999, the supplier is entitled to ask you to agree that these conditions do not apply to you. If you sign this form, you will be agreeing that your rights to sue the supplier under the Fair Trading Act 1999 if you are killed or injured because the services were not rendered with due care and skill or they were not reasonably fit for their purpose, are excluded, restricted or modified in the way set out in this form.

NOTE: The change to your rights, as set out in this form, does not apply if your death or injury is due to gross negligence on the supplier's part. "Gross negligence" is defined in the Fair Trading (Recreational Services) Regulations 2004.

For the purposes of the clause 3, "the Supplier" shall mean and include the Indemnitees.

5. INDEMNITY AND RELEASE GIVEN TO ORGANISERS

IN CONSIDERATION of the acceptance of me as a participant in the Meeting:

- a) I AGREE TO INDEMNIFY AND KEEP INDEMNIFIED to the full extent permitted by law the Indemnitees and each of them in the following manner:
 - i) that I participate in the meeting at my sole risk and responsibility;
 - ii) that I accept the Venue as it stands with all or any defects hidden or exposed;
 - iii) that I indemnify and hold harmless the Indemnitees, their respective servants, agents, officials and competitors against any actions, costs, losses or claims which may be made by me or on my behalf for or in respect of or arising out of my death or any injury loss or damage caused to me or my equipment whether caused by negligence, breach of contract or in any other manner whatsoever.
- b) I AGREE TO RELEASE to the full extent permitted by law the Indemnitees and each of them from all liability to me for any claim, loss, damage, cost or expense (whether arising under statute, from negligence, personal injury, psychological trauma, death, property damage or infringement of third party rights or otherwise) that arises as a result of any act, matter or thing done, permitted or omitted to be done by me or which is in any way connected with my presence at or involvement in the Event.
- 6. The release and indemnity provided by me in this declaration is in addition to, and will not in any way limit the application of, the conditions of sale attaching to tickets, conditions of entry, conditions of credentials or any other applicable terms or conditions in respect of the Event.
- 7. A term of this release and indemnity will not apply where the term contravenes the law of the relevant jurisdiction under which any legal action is legitimately taken however such terms are severable and do not invalidate the remaining terms.

8. MEDICAL

I declare that I am and must continue to be medically and physically fit and able to participate in the Meeting. I will immediately notify MA in writing via my SCB of any change to my fitness and ability to participate. I understand and accept the Indemnitees will continue to rely upon this declaration as evidence of my fitness and ability to participate.

9. I acknowledge and agree that if required, the Indemnitees (or any of them) may arrange medical or hospital treatment (including ambulance transportation) for me. I authorise such actions being taken by the Indemnitees and agree to meet all costs associated with such action. I understand it is compulsory for me to have ambulance insurance in some form and I accept responsibility for the cost of ambulance transportation, ambulance cover and further agree to maintain ambulance cover during the term of my license / membership.

10. PRIVACY

I hereby consent to the collection of my personal information by the Promoter/Event Organiser, MA and the SCB in connection with my involvement at the Event and the use and disclosure of my personal information by Event Organiser, and MA to other agencies and officials associated with the Event for the purposes of conducting and managing the Event. I understand that I may gain access to my personal information held by contacting MA at 147 Montague St, South Melbourne, Victoria, 3205. I understand that if I do not provide the personal information requested above that I may not be permitted to participate in the Event.

11. PERSONAL HEALTH INFORMATION

I hereby agree with MA and the SCB that in consideration for my participation in the Event that MA and the SCB may receive, collect, store and use personal health information about me in the manner set out below.

- a) **I ACKNOWLEDGE that:**
 - i) If I am injured, become ill or die at or following the Event the party listed at Item 8 in Schedule 1 in addition to any hospital at which I am treated (together "my Carers") will have health related

information about me in their possession, power and control relating to me which is subject to obligations imposed by the Privacy Act ("my Information") and the Privacy Act is intended to protect my personal information;

- ii) MA and my SCB wish to collect my Information for purposes that include their risk management programs, evaluating and improving the safety of MA and SCB events and of the Meeting organisers and facility providers of MA / SCB permitted events, and generally to reduce the risks to persons engaged in motorcycle sport; and
- iii) It is reasonable for MA and my SCB to collect, store, use and disclose my Information in accordance with clause 11(a)(i) above and in the manner set out in clause 11(b).
- b) **IN CONSIDERATION** of my acceptance as an entrant in the Meeting I consent and agree that MA and my SCB:
 - i) may collect and store any of my Information, including obtain my Information from third parties including my Carers;
 - ii) may use any information collected in accordance with this clause for any purpose consistent with creating safer competition in motorcycle sport and events held by or in conjunction with MA, my SCB, or with an MA or SCB permit;
 - iii) may disclose my Information to third parties provided such disclosure is reasonably intended to be used for the purpose of improving safety at events held by or in conjunction with MA, or with an MA permit provided any such information is held by MA or my SCB in accordance with the MA Privacy Policy;
 - c) I irrevocably authorise MA and my SCB and hereby appoint MA and my SCB as my lawful attorneys to collect from my Carers, and I hereby direct my Carers to provide to MA or my SCB upon request being made by MA or my SCB, any of my Information including but not limited to any information concerning any incident or event causing or contributing to or resulting from any injury, illness or death to me, the details of any diagnosis and prognosis provided to me by my Carers (or any party with the knowledge of any of my Carers), and any other matter to the knowledge of my Carers that might reasonably be considered to be requested by MA or my SCB for the purpose of improving safety at MA and SCB events.

12. POLICIES AND REGULATIONS

I acknowledge, understand and agree that it is a condition of my participation in the Event that I agree to be bound by, and subject to, the rules, regulations and jurisdiction of MA as amended from time to time. Copies of all MA rules, policies and regulations are available by contacting the MA office.

13. All participants are bound by the MA anti doping policy and thus understand they may be subject to drug testing. Testing conducted by the Australian Sports Anti-Doping Authority (ASADA) is in accordance with the ASADA Act and the National Anti-Doping Scheme. This involves the taking of a sample (any human biological fluid or tissue whether alive or otherwise, or any human breath) for the purpose of detecting the use of a Prohibited Drug or Doping Method. Any participant infringing MA's policy or refusing a drug test may be disqualified or otherwise dealt with in accordance with the terms of the anti-doping policy.
